Dear Students, Parents & Guardians,

First and foremost, we want to thank you for your patience, support, and grace throughout the past six months. We know this pandemic has changed our world drastically and no one has probably felt the effects of this more than our Pre/K-12th grade student body along with their parents and guardians. We miss our students and have been working hard this summer to create flexible learning plans that will accommodate any potential school closures.

So what does our return to learning look like this fall?

We started planning for the 2020/2021 school year with three big goals in mind:

1. Provide for the health & safety of our students, staff, and community.
2. See all of our Pre/K-12th grade students everyday in-person.
3. Introduce a new online/in-person (hybrid) system of learning that would be flexible enough to flow between face-to-face learning and online/at-home learning in the event of a Covid-19 partial or full closure.

Since the emergence of COVID-19 last spring, two constant and crucial things have become very clear to us: We have learned that we need to remain **flexible**, and we know the Davenport School District is completely **dedicated** to providing the best educational opportunity for our students. For example, last week on Tuesday, August 4, we had created an in-person, 8 - 2 PM, four-day-a-week schedule ready to

Planning Phases & Protocols



Bus Transportation Protocols

All drivers and other school staff on the bus must wear a cloth face covering when not working alone.

Students must wear a face mask or face shield before boarding the bus, while riding on the bus and while departing the bus.

Each student will be screened before boarding the bus headed to school. Parents will be asked to be present at the bus stop in case the student needs to be sent home. Note: students will not be allowed to eat on the bus at any time.

- If the student's temperature is high (above 100.4 degrees) and/or if the student is expressing or displaying significant possible symptoms of COVID-19, the student will not be allowed to ride the bus.
- The driver or other school staff member on the bus will contact the parent/guardian immediately and notify the parent/guardian that the student has possible symptoms and will not be permitted to ride the bus.
- If the driver or other school staff member is not able to make contact with the parent/guardian, the driver/other school staff member will immediately contact Mr. Ball. If he is not available, then contact one of the principals or the superintendent will be notified.
- If the driver or other school staff member on the bus is not able to reach any of the administrators listed above, the student will be isolated and separated as much as possible (at least 6 feet from any other students) on the bus until the bus arrives at school or until other arrangements have been made.

According to the OSPI Reopening Schools Planning Guide, the following principles for COVID prevention within school transportation are to be followed:

- Maximize outside air and keep windows open as much as possible.
- Keep riders as far apart as possible on the bus.
- Note: family members will be grouped together and there will be assigned seats for all riders

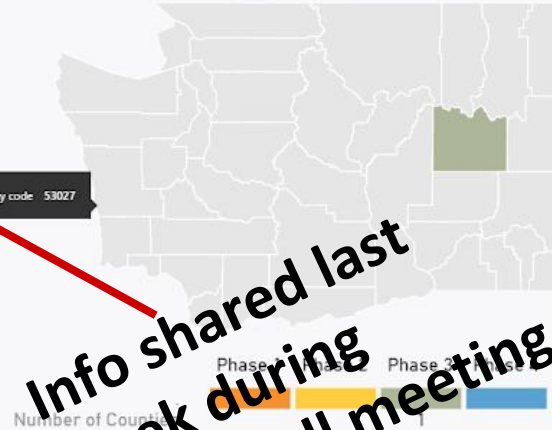

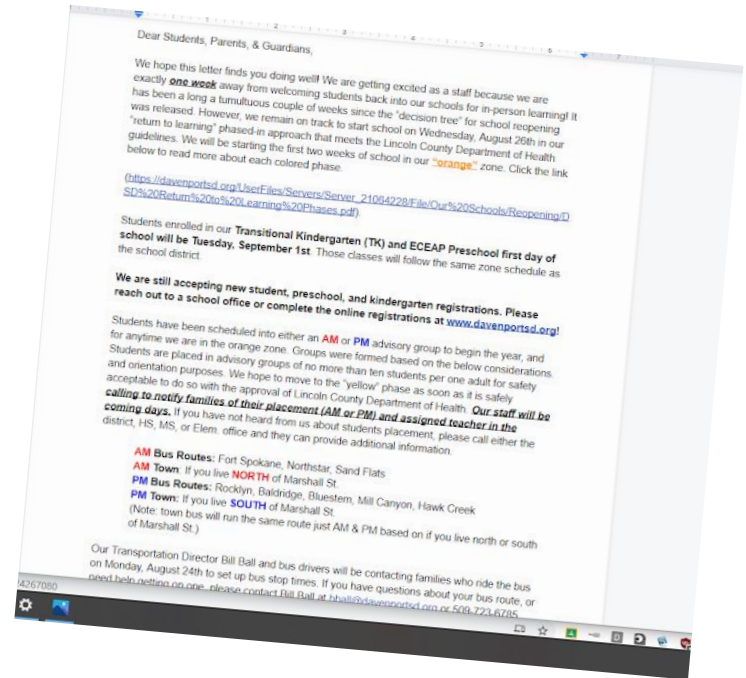
